### **BACKGROUND**

The Daniels Associates of Australasia Pty Ltd (the organisation) submitted an application for renewal of registration and following the audit (AUD 1003914) conducted on 29 and 30 August 2013 was found to be non-compliant with the Standards for NVR Registered Training Organisations 2011. On 6 February 2014, the Commissioner Compliance, Dianne Orr decided to renew the organisation's registration and to give it a notice to suspend ten qualifications. The organisation submitted its response to ASQA's intention to suspend ten qualifications. On 27 June 2014, the Commissioner Compliance, Dianne Orr decided to not suspend five of the qualifications and to suspend four of the qualifications. The organisation withdrew one of the qualifications from its scope of registration.

The organisation submitted an application for reconsideration and on 17 September 2014 the Commissioners decided to vary its decision to not suspend two of the four qualifications and invited the organisation to address a newly identified non-compliance for one qualification. On 31 October 2014, the Commissioners decided not to suspend the two qualifications. The Commissioners approved the conduct of a compliance monitoring audit, nominally within 12 months, to assess the organisation's ongoing compliance.

In addition, ASQA received two complaints. One complaint (ID: 1010750) was concerned with the sufficiency of training and assessment relating to the *SITXFSA101 Use hygienic practices for food safety* unit of competency. It was noted that ASQA advised the organisation of this complaint on 3 March 2016 and the organisation provided a response on 9 March 2016. The evidence provided in your response was reviewed as part of the audit. The second complaint (ID: 1011028) is concerned with the sufficiency of learner support and IT systems to support learning. The scope of the audit included the *Standards for Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) 2015* relevant to these complaints.

The organisation runs two delivery sites, one at Unit 16/7 Revelation Close, Tighes Hill in New South Wales and the other at 15 Godwin Street, Bulimba in Queensland. The Queensland office operates under the organistion's trading name, Hospitality Institute of Australasia.

The organisation delivers training and assessment via a blended delivery mode of predominantly online and some face to face workshops, utilising employer engagement through funded traineeship arrangements.

The organisation currently has ten qualifications on its scope of registration. These are as follows:


